MWFA Panel: No Chance Fastener Prices Dropping

The Mid-West Fastener Association panel program called for the subject to be "Fastener Inflation," but the tariff element of rising prices from steel to screws dominated the discussion.

Charles Kerr, CEO of third-generation socket screw domestic manufacturer Kerr Lakeside, cited a steel price going from \$25 in Q4 2017 to \$39 in May 2018 as an example of what the threat of tariffs do. Scrap steel in 2015 was \$4.14/hundred weight. Now in 2018 it is \$9.70. "That's got to be reflected in the selling price of product," Kerr noted. "A lot of this is supply-driven in anticipation of tariffs," he observed.

Panic buying is adding to the supply problem, said Paul Cincinello, who has been in steel brokerage for 30+ years and said he "cut his teeth in the steel industry on fastener products in Rockford." He is president of Worldwide Logistics. Cincinello observed that suppliers have had to "protect inventory from the panic buying of past 30 days."

Tabitha Herbst, sales and commercial development for Central Wire, said "232 involves every part of our every day." How much are nuts a "direct threat to security?" she asked.

The Trump administration has justified steel and aluminum tariffs after the

Commerce Department decided that steel and aluminum imports "threaten to impair the national security," as defined by Section 232 of the Trade Expansion Act of 1962.

"Friday, June 15th is now d-day," George Hunt, regional manager for Brighton-Best International, declared. "You will see price increases on Monday, June 18."

On May 29 the Trump administration decided to proceed with its proposal to impose 25% tariffs on \$50 billion worth of goods from China. Meant to pressure China on trade issues, the 301 tariffs involve a range of products exported to the U.S., from flat screen TVs to medical devices.

Currently all nuts (HS code 73181600), including inch, metric, and locking nuts, are on the list of goods that will receive the 25% duty. The final list of items will be announced on June 15, with tariffs imposed shortly thereafter.

"Are finished nuts 'intellectual property'?" Hunt asked of the 301 rationale. "Everyone here knows 'No!' but the administration had to get to \$50 billion."

Kerr noted that "long term, loyal customers will get product before others who couldn't find fasteners anywhere else.

Kerr pointed out that suppliers have to consider replacement costs and that increases prices with the tariff cloud hanging over. There are many questions on what tariffs will ultimately cover. For example, Kerr asked if tariffs will be

applied to the steel or the processing too?

None of the panelists expressed support for tariffs. The Bush tariffs, implemented in 2002, led to the loss of 200,000+ U.S. jobs, Kerr said. The consequences of the 232 steel tariffs could be even worse for U.S. companies because the 2002 tariffs were not applied to Canada and Mexico.

Herbst noted that wire suppliers have to price on market value now. It isn't just the threat of tariffs, Herbst pointed out:
Operational costs, recruiting employees in the low-unemployment market and overtime are raising prices.

When costs go up, suppliers "will pass it on," Herbst noted.

Customers need to know that lead times are up from eight weeks to 12 weeks, Herbst added.

There is no chance of prices going down. "Demand is up," Hunt explained. "Vendors are not lowering prices."

There are other factors in prices than tariffs and demand, Kerr pointed out. He cited supply of electrodes for steel processing as an example. China essentially controls the supply, he explained.

It is vital to talk to your customers and have an "open and clear line of communication," Kerr advised.

Ultimately on the whole tariff issue, "the right hand doesn't know what the left hand is doing," Kerr declared.





SWD Inc. Begins Work on 25,000 sq. ft. Extension

On June 7th, 2018, SWD Inc. held a groundbreaking ceremony to celebrate a 26,000 sq. ft. expansion of their existing 160,000 sq. ft. facility. In attendance were Village of Addison Officials, representatives from BMO Harris Bank, and members of Laub Construction. With this addition, SWD projects growth of 15% in year-over-year sales and expects that anywhere from 12-15 new positions will be created.

The current expansion is the second phase of a project that added 60,000 sq. ft. in 2012. The extra 26,000 sq. ft. will help with process flow in this state-of-the-art coating production facility. It has been designed to allow for more warehousing with an automated racking system for part storage along with new office space for centralized shipping, receiving, and order entry processing.

The 3 million dollar addition follows a series of investments. This expansion is aligned with SWD's mission to "Bring our customers the highest level of quality and service in the metal finishing industry". SWD Inc. specializes in Black Oxide, Passivation of Stainless Steel, Phosphate coatings (Zinc, Manganese & Iron), Fastener Sorting and licensed application of High Corrosion Magni, Dörken and Yuken coating systems. Last year, SWD introduced a state-of-the-art robotic organic coating line with unprecedented production capabilities.

This project is expected to take six months and should be finished by November 2018.
